Washington's Michelle Reid Named 2021 AASA National Superintendent of the Year®

Announcement Made at AASA's National Conference on Education

Alexandria, Va. – Feb. 18, 2021 – Michelle Reid, Ed.D. superintendent of Northshore School District in Bothell, Wash., has been named the 2021 AASA National Superintendent of the Year®. - Professionalism constant improvement of administrative knowledge and skills, while providing professional development opportunities and motivation to others on the education team; and
- Community involvement active participation in local community activities and an understanding of regional, national and international issues.

A \$10,000 college scholarship will be presented in the name of the 2021 AASA National Superintendent of the Year® to a student in the high school from which the superintendent graduated, or the school now serving the same area.
