#### 4. PSAT Testing in October

This year's PSAT will be given on Wednesday October 13. Here is what will happen all over campus on that date:

- 9th Graders: will participate in safe/physically distanced programs about Suicide Prevention, Digital Citizenship, Academic Honesty, Future Planning and will engage in a Commitment to Graduate Program
- 10th Graders: take the PSAT as good practice for the future (no registration needed - all 10th graders already registered - most students with IEPs have been exempted from testing)



 11th Graders: take the PSAT as part of the National Merit Scholarship program (no

registration needed - all 11th graders already registered - most students with IEPs have been exempted from testing)

12th Graders: will participate in safe/physically distanced programs about Senior Year, the High School and Beyond Plan, Class Rings and will engage in a Commitment to Graduate Program

#### 5. Speeding Up Lunch Lines

Sometimes, the lunch lines are long! One way to speed this up is for your student to have their school-issued ID card with them at all times. At lunch, rather than give their name or type in their student number, all they have to do is **scan their ID card**. Fast, simple, efficient. Let's say scanning saves each student 4 seconds. That does not sound like much but if there are 100 kids in line, 4 seconds per student speeds the line up by almost 7 full minutes!

#### 6. Matching Curriculum with Community

North Creek is piloting a process intended to make our curriculum better match our student body. Here is the question crafted by our district partners:
