NEWS and INFORMATION

1. Halloween Costume Rules

Students wishing to wear costumes to school, football games, or other school-related events must keep these guidelines in mind:

- Regular school dress code applies (underclothing/lingerie is not appropriate as a costume please refer to district and school dress code policy).
- Costumes should not, in any way, disrupt the learning environment (ability to carry school supplies, being seated in class, blocking view of others, etc.).
- Costumes may not demean any race, ethnic group, disabling condition, religion, nationality, gender, gender identity or sexual orientation.
- Costumes cannot reflect graphic violence or gang affiliation.
- No full-face or pullover masks.
- No props or look-a-like weapons of any kind (i.e. anything you can hold in your hands is a prop, for example, swords, baseball bats, etc. Please refer to the district's weapons policy).
- No silly string or slime.
- Shoes must be worn.
- Pacifiers, baby bottles, false teeth, anything placed in the mouth, and glow sticks are not allowed. These items are considered paraphernalia associated with drug use.
- NO CLOWN COSTUMES We are asking for your cooperation in not allowing students to dress up as clowns at any school event due to the disruption and fear it may cause. If anyone shows up with a clown-related costume, they will be asked to change or be sent home.

Keep in mind that all school guidelines still apply. Students will be expected to comply with staff member requests to make the appropriate changes in dress/costume. The success of this day, as always, will impact consideration of future dress up days.

If you have any questions as to whether the costume is appropriate or not, please ask an administrator before the costume is worn to school or a school event.

Thank you for your cooperation and assistance in helping to make wear costumes fun but not disruptive or inappropriate.

4. What's happening in C3 (Counseling, College, and Career)

The Counseling department has been busy in the month of October. Counselors delivered High School & Beyond presentations to our freshmen students on October 3rd and 4th. These presentations consisted of information about North Creek, the counseling department's role in their high school experience, the high school credit system, graduation requirements, activities at the school, and more. Following the presentation students were given the opportunity to complete High School & Beyond assignments on Naviance. After these were completed, the counselors conducted one-on-one meetings with the entire freshman class. For students who were missed during this process counselors will be doing follow up meetings in the coming weeks.

On October 12th, PSAT day at the school, counselors participated in freshmen workshop rotation, as well as a senior activity. All freshmen went through a four workshop rotation, where they participated in all of the workshops. Some counselors led a workshop with freshmen on planning, and inputting into Naviance, a four year course planner where students design what their high school experience could look like. Some counselors led a workshop on suicide prevention, where students were taught the LEARN model (look for signs, empathize and listen, ask questions, reduce the dangers, and next steps) to help save lives. Finally, some counselors worked with our senior class on completion of their High School & Beyond plans in naviance.

Similar to the Freshmen presentations, the counselors also conducted Juniors High School & Beyond presentations on October 17th and 18th. The focus of these presentations were graduation requirements, post high school career/education opportunities, and the 4 year college experience. Following the presentation students were given the opportunity to complete High School & Beyond assignments on Naviance. Just like with our freshmen, the juniors all got one-on-one meetings with their counselors.

We are excited about the work that we get to do with your students and hope they are learning from the presentations.

9. AP Exam Information

Many students still have not registered for their AP classes and exams on College Board!

The College Board site is where students utilize all classroom materials for classwork, homework, and sample tests. It is critical that students register on this site because this is where all exams are ordered, as well!

The AP Exam process is done in 2 easy steps:

- 1. Register on College Board. Students should have done this in class, but if not, please contact me for Join Code information and I can help!
- 2. The next step is to pay for the exam(s). This year we are piloting a new program for payment that is hopefully easier and more convenient for you and your student. You may pay for exams on <u>TouchBase</u>, which is the site where you have paid for all school fees like yearbook, class fees, unpaid fines, PE uniforms, etc. The fees for exams are \$108 each, with the exception of Research and Seminar which are \$145 each. If you need a login for TouchBase, please contact Kwaligorski@nsd.org, or kwallace@nsd.org.

That's it, you are done! When you have completed both steps, I will order your student's exam(s).

Please note: Exams will NOT be ordered unless registered on College Board and paid in full on TouchBase, or in person.

Deadline to pay is Nov. 1st, 2022

Students must be registered and paid in full by Nov. 1st **to avoid any late fees of \$40 per exam** (I am happy to discuss scholarship and financial aid requests, as well.).

If you need financial assistance, or would like to apply for Free/Reduced school fees, please pick up a form in my office, fill it out and turn it in at the Cashier's window by the main office (various language options available on request).

If you would like to pay in person at school, you may pay by cc or check at the Cashier's window, as well.
